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INTRODUCTION

The **Third Session** of the 11th Parliament began on **Friday 29th September, 2017** by Proclamation [Legal Notice 106 of 2017] and prorogued on **Thursday 27th September, 2018** by Proclamation of His Excellency [Legal Notice 130 of 2018].

This Report outlines the Business conducted by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago during this Third Session of the Eleventh Parliament.

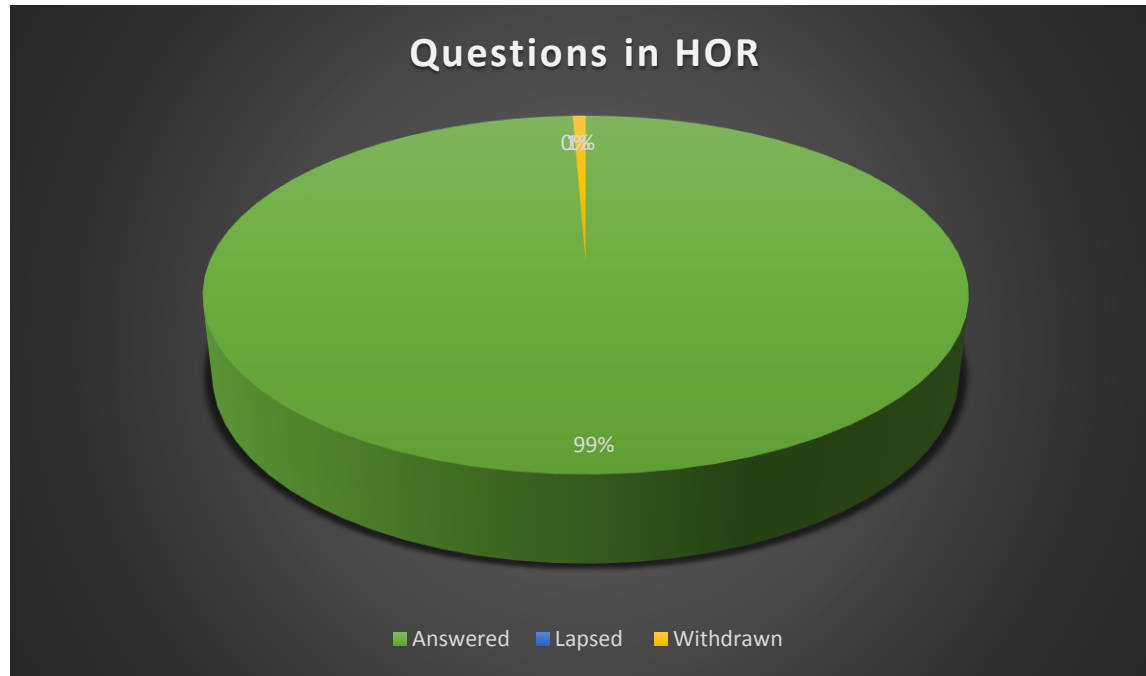

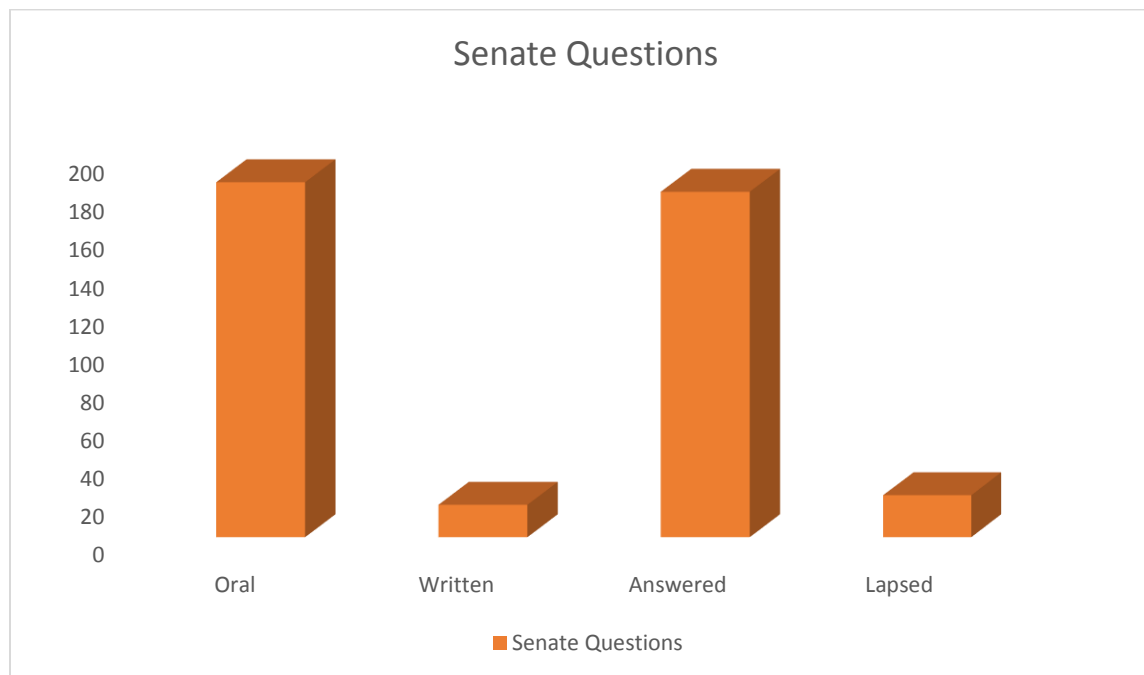

- (D) Enterprises owned or controlled by or on behalf of the State or which received funding from the State of more than two third of its total income in any one year; and*
- (E) Service Commissions, in relation to their administration, the manner of the exercise of their powers, their methods of functioning and any criteria adopted by them in the exercise of their powers and functions;*

STANDING ORDERS 88 (2) and 99 (1) of the Senate and House of Representatives respectively give effect to the operations of these Committees.

These Committees are established for the life of a Parliament.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE (PAC)

Section 119(1) of the Constitution of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago provides for the establishment of the PAC. The PAC examines reports of the Auditor General on the various Accounts of Government Ministries and Agencies. The PAC is assisted by the Auditor General and has powers to send for persons, papers and records.

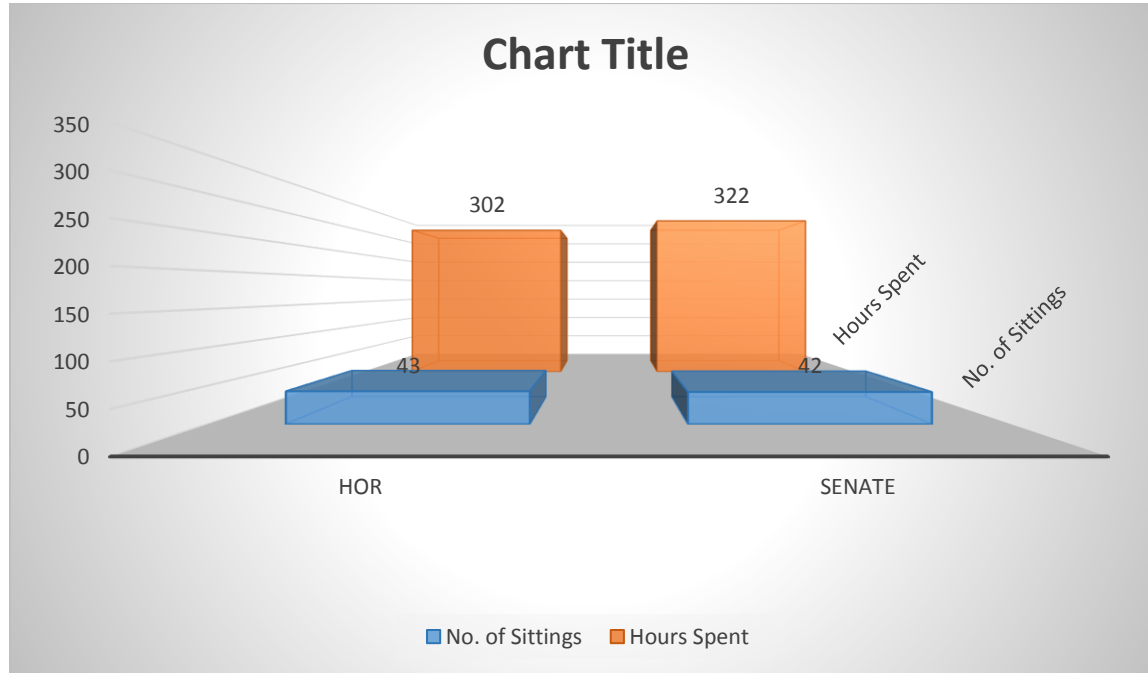

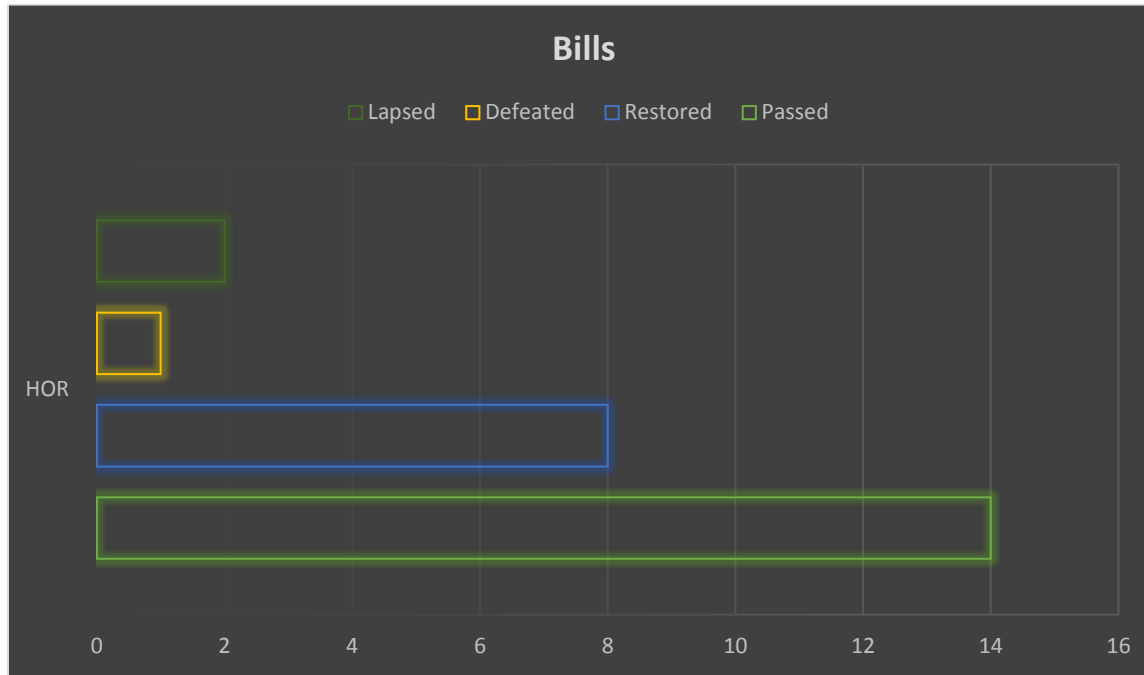
This graph illustrates the number of questions filed and answered in both houses during the Third Session of the Eleventh Parliament.

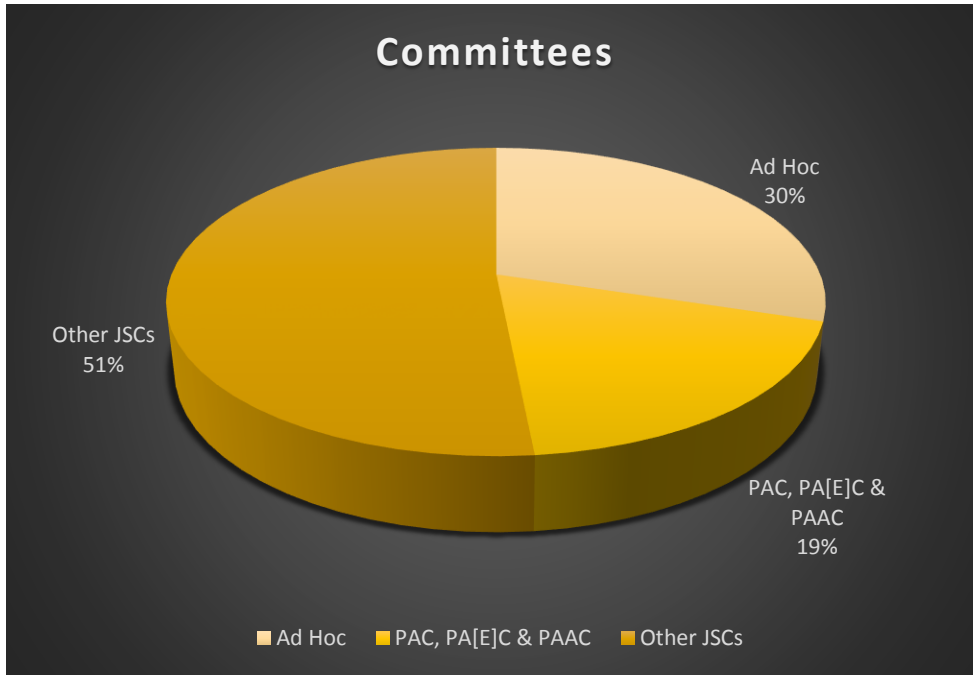
